Companies that use pallets often experience high maintenance costs on their pallets due to damages caused by faulty pallet handling. Repair and replacement of pallets accumulates to a level of needless logistic asset expenses that can easily be avoided.

Keep the forks horizontal during lifting, placing and driving.



Use the correct size forks to avoid damage



Place the load in such way, that the weight is evenly distributed over the pallet, to avoid



Introduce designated areas in warehouse for placing and storing the pallets to avoid dangerous situations or reduction of





To create balance whilst carrying a load the centre distance of the forks compared to the width of the pallet needs to be at least 60%.





Do not shove pallets, always lift pallets for repositioning.

pushing a pallet



Lift the pallet whilst moving 20 centimetres from the ground to avoid hitting e.g. doorsteps.





Be careful with pallets, do not throw them.



TIP10

Ensure sufficient space on three sides of the pallet when placing them in the shelves.



Use forks with sufficient length in case of carrying





Stack pallets in neat rows to prevent unstable stacks, which might create dangerous situations.





Keep your pallets clean and usable. Treat them with a little more caution for a longer useful life.
